




The Tradition of Akron Soccer



Akron Soccer has a rich tradition, beginning with its inaugural season in 1955. Over the course of 59 years, the Zips have seen the program reach unthinkable heights. 2010 NCAA National Champions, Akron is perennially competing as the nation's No. 1 program in Division I College Soccer. Akron has advanced to the NCAA Tournament 28 times including back-to-back appearances in the championship game in 2009 and 2010. The program has produced 53 All-America selections, including 16 honors since 2007. The Zips' historic 2010 campaign

capped off one of the most impressive two-year runs the college soccer world has ever seen. From 2009-10, the Zips,

who lost just once during the regular run of play over 50 matches, posted an overall mark of 45-2-3.

Leaving little doubt of its strength of schedule, Akron achieved this success while playing the most difficult competition in college soccer with the No. 1-ranked RPI in the final regular-season release in 2009 and the No.1ranked non-conference RPI in 2010.

Akron captured the school's first national championship in any sport in 2010, earning a 1-0 victory over Louisville at the College Cup in Santa Barbara. Calif., with a team that featured a trio of Hermann Trophy candidates. Senior midfielder Anthony Ampaipitakwong, junior defender Kofi Sarkodie and eventually Hermann Trophy winner Darlington Nagbe guided the Zips to the No. 1-ranking in the country throughout the fall and an NCAA record-setting run of 11 consecutive shutouts.

UA followed up its historic campaign by capturing its seventh straight Mid-American Conference regular season championship and making another deep run into the NCAA postseason in 2011.Records continued to fall in 2012 when Akron posted an overall record of 18-1-3 and ran the table in the MAC with a 7-0 mark, before capturing its fifth league tournament title in six seasons. In doing so, UA pushed its league unbeaten streak to 47 matches (44-0-3) to set another NCAA standard. After making another trip to the NCAA Tournament Round of 16, the 2012 season culminated with Akron producing six more professional players for Major League Soccer. Akron became one of just eight Division I schools to reach the NCAA

Tournament in each of the last seven seasons in 2013 while securing 17 wins and MAC regular season and tournament titles. Since 2007, the Zips have recorded the No. 1 winning percentage in all of NCAA Division I college soccer.

Akron Soccer Camp Staff

Akron head coach Jared Embick, the 2013 Ohio Collegiate Soccer Association Coach of the Year, serves as camp director. Since joining the Zips coaching staff in 2007, Coach Embick, the 2010 NCAA National Assistant Coach of the Year recipient, has guided Akron to one of the most dominating spells the game of college soccer has ever seen. In the 2009 and 2010 season's Akron became the first school to advance to the national championship game in back-to-back seasons, the first school to do so since 2003 and 2004. The 2011 season saw the Zips break the NCAA's longest home unbeaten streak record with 48 games without a loss, a record that had been untouchable since 1992.

During Embick's tenure on staff, 23 Zips have been selected in to Major League Soccer since 2007, including 17 MLS SuperDraft selections. History was made in January 2011 as Akron Soccer became the focal point of the MLS SuperDraft. In all, 7 members of the 2010 national championship winning Zips squad had their names called, including 5 of the first 8 picks. The 5 first-round selections set an MLS record as did the 7 players drafted overall. Akron's prominence as a pipeline to the pro's continued in 2011 as Darren Mattocks, was selected with the #2 overall pick by the Vancouver Whitecaps. The 2013 MLS season saw 6 more Zips join the professional ranks

It was business as usual this past January as 4 members of the 2013 team had their names called in the 2014 MLS Draft!

The Staff

Coach Embick has worked hard to bring together a staff of top college, high school and club coaches as well as some of Akron's top players. Your skills and overall playing ability will advance with the experience and knowledge of our professional coaching staff.



Each Day Camp session will focus on skill development for young soccer players. Campers will learn soccer skills and techniques through exercises and games specifically designed for the young player. Time

Facilities

The Akron Soccer Day Camp provides an exceptional learning environment. Outstanding training facilities, grass and sports turf fields, indoor gyms, and a pool, all enhance the camp experience. Cost

The camp fee is \$235.00 per week and includes a camp t-shirt. A reduced rate of \$220.00 per camper is available to University of Akron employees and families enrolling more than one child or enrolling one child for more than one week. Campers can bring a ball from home or purchase a hand stitched Akron ball for \$35.00. Campers will also need to bring their lunch from home each day but will be provided a snack in the morning. Little Stars Open to All Boys and Girls, ages 4-6 Week 1: June 9-13/Week 2: June 23-27 \$120.00

The Little Stars section of camp is a great way to expose boys and girls aged 4-6 to soccer in a fun and safe environment. Camp will run from 9 a.m.-11 a.m. Monday - Friday. The main objective is to teach basic soccer skills and games. The cost for a week of camp is \$120.00 and includes an Akron Soccer t-shirt.

Residential/Commuter Camp Open to All Boys ages 10-18 Week 1 : July 10-13/ Week 2: July 16-19 \$595 Residential/\$500 Commuter

2014 will see Akron Soccer offer its annual two weeks of our popular Residential/Commuter camp. Our overall goal of the camp is to educate and challenge players of all levels, while they discover what it means to be a part of the NCAA National Championship Akron environment!

Camp will offer technical and tactical sessions delivered by our nationally recognized coaching staff to campers who will be placed into age and ability specific developmental groups. Our curriculum is designed to challenge each player through the combination of 11v11 and small sided match play, coupled with daily training sessions. A recruiting seminar for our high school campers and nightly competition with our camp staff are some of the special features that will be offered at the camp.

Camp is open to all boys ages 10-18. Field players and goalkeepers are welcome, however goalkeeper slots are very limited and will fill up quickly. Because of the nature of this camp, activities are designed and the focus will be on high level soccer players who have aspirations of playing in high school, college or beyond.

Goalkeeping Sessions

Specialized goalkeeping sessions are held each week of camp. Akron is becoming known as the breeding ground for top-flight goalkeepers. At the Akron Soccer Camp the goalkeeper is not the "forgotten player." Our experienced goalkeeping staff will teach you the key technical, tactical, psychological, and physical aspects of this crucial position. Individualized training and evaluation is only one aspect of our goalkeeping program. The training experience is further enhanced as the goalkeepers are incorporated into small and large group tactical and technical training activities with the field players. These match-related activities provide the goalkeepers an opportunity to blend technical fundamentals with tactical decision making. The goalkeepers are also evaluated as they perform in 11v11 matches everyday. The combination of individual and team training is an integral part in the development of a goalkeeper.

Housing. Meals and Recreation

Residential campers will utilize the same facilities as The University of Akron Men's Soccer players. During their stay, campers reside and dine in the Akron residence halls to get the full experience of a Zips soccer player. Campers will be housed two in a room and all linens will be provided. One roommate request will be accepted per application. Residential Campers will be given 3 meals a day, while commuters will be served lunch and dinner. All meals are all-you-caneat, and will be served in the Robertson Dining Hall and Student Union.

In addition, the multi-million dollar Student Union and Student Recreation Centers will be open to all campers during free time for swimming, bowling, billiards and movies.

Residential and Commuter Enrollment Info Camp Fees

The fee for overnight campers is \$595. Commuter campers pay \$500. How to Enroll

All registration details are online at www.AkronSoccerCamp.com Those who cannot attend camp for medical or other reasons will be refunded all but a \$50 administrative fee. To receive a refund the camp office must be notified at least 72 hours before camp begins. A \$200 deposit is required when you sign-up. Refunds are not issued for any soccer related injury or illness occurred during camp. All payment balances are due by July 1, 2014.

Roommates

Campers will be housed in the new Spicer Dorms on the Akron campus. Overnight campers may indicate choice of roommates. Campers will be housed in two bedroom, one bathroom suites with two beds in each bedroom. All linens will be provided.

Check In

Camp registration is planned between noon and 2 p.m. on the first day of camp. The first training session starts at 3:30 p.m. Camp ends on the final day following the closing ceremonies at approximately 4:00 p.m.

Camp Ball

Each camper must have a soccer ball at camp. You can bring your own ball or purchase a hand-stitched Akron soccer ball from the camp for \$35 paid in advance. Availability is limited. Please mark the appropriate box during the registration process. Camp Insurance

The Akron Soccer Camp carries secondary medical insurance. Parents are expected to provide primary medical insurance for their child.

Transportation

The Akron/Canton Airport is located 10 minutes from the camp, also the Cleveland Hopkins airport is located 40 minutes from the camp. Bus and train stations also serve the Akron area. The camp will provide transportation to and from the Akron/Canton airport at no charge. Please call (330) 972-6895 for details on this service.


